Message from the Village President



Dear River Forest Residents,

Welcome to March. We've hardly had a winter, and now spring is fast approaching with much to report.

In the coming weeks, we will take the first steps toward creating a tax increment finance district along North Avenue. We will update a development blueprint, determine if the area still qualifies and examine the boundaries, which had been set for North from Thatcher Avenue east to Harlem Avenue. We also will call on our volunteers on the Economic Development Commission to look at these reports before they come back to the Board of Trustees for approval.

TIFs are a tool to jump-start development, which will stabilize our property taxes and strengthen property values. These are goals that have the best chance of succeeding by improving our commercial tax base.

This process will take several months. From the outset, we will be more proactive in our outreach to you about our progress. One of the lessons we learned from Madison Street was that we needed to get information out sooner. So, in addition to regular communications, we will again set up a distinct page on our website, www.vrf.us, about the process, the purpose of a TIF and other pertinent information.

River Forest will also provide information on the TIF process by way of social media. Results from a recent survey showed that Facebook was the site residents primarily used, and preferred that the Village use to engage on social media. A soft-launch of the site will occur later this month and will be followed by more formal efforts in April. This is our first foray into the world of social media, and we hope you find it useful and informative.

We will use Facebook as well to keep the community apprised of the work of all of our commissions, including our newest, on sustainability. In January, the Board of Trustees made sustainability a priority by unanimously voting to elevate the

Forest Park St. Patrick's Day Parade

On Saturday March 4, 2017 Forest Park will host their annual St. Patrick's Day Parade. The parade will begin at 1 PM at Madison St. and Van Buren and will travel East on Madison St. into Forest Park.

There will be parking on the east side only in the 000 and 100 blocks of Ashland and Franklin and in the 000 block of Park. There will be parking only on the south side of Vine from Lathrop to Park. Vehicle and pedestrian traffic is expected to be heavy in this area from 12 noon until 2 PM. Lathrop, Ashland, Franklin and Park will be open to local/resident traffic only and will be closed at Madison St. Madison St. will be closed from Lathrop to Park during the parade.

Road Closure on 1000 Block of Bonnie Brae – March 8 – 9

Concordia University is beginning the next phase of construction on its new dormitory on the southeast portion of their campus. The construction will require the 1000 Block of Bonnie Brae to be closed for two days while a crane is erected. Access to streets and sidewalks will be restricted from 7 AM – 6 PM on March 8 and 9. Should weather impact the work, March 10 will be used as a make-up date.

Know the Code!

The Village would like to remind you:

- As the warmer months approach, please remember that all dogs must be leashed when on any public street, sidewalk, parkway, public area or unenclosed premises within the Village. Please see Section 8-3 of the [Village code](#) for all dog control information.
- Please note: Although the weather is warming earlier, yard waste collection does not start until April. The first date for yard waste collection is Tuesday April 4th, 2017.
 - "Yard waste" includes trees or tree branches (not exceeding four inches in diameter), brush, plant stalks and shrubs cut up and bound into bundles of no more than four feet in length and fifty pounds in weight, which bundles shall be bound with biodegradable twine and shall have one universal solid waste tag affixed to each bundle. Yard waste is also grass clippings, leaves, twigs, weeds and all other materials of similar nature placed in biodegradable paper bags (up to thirty two gallons in capacity) and affixed with one universal solid waste tag. It is unlawful for any person to mix yard waste with other garbage and refuse.
 - For non-alley collections, properly packaged yard waste will be picked up "curbside". Materials placed for such collection may not be put out prior to 6:00 PM on Monday (the day before yard waste collection) and will be picked up on Tuesday. For alley collection, properly packaged yard waste may be placed for collection next to the regular garbage collection point. It is unlawful to place yard waste within the street, alley or walkway.

Short Term Rentals Prohibited in River Forest

Recently, an industry has emerged that allows homeowners to list homes online for lodging and rental for short term stays whether or not they are present during these stays. This type of use is prohibited under the River Forest Municipal Code. Property owners who violate the Village Code will be expected to bring their home into immediate compliance. Failure to do so can result in the issuance of citation(s). The Village is not responsible for any fines

Illinois Department of Transportation Project on Madison Street this Spring

The Illinois Department of Transportation is planning to resurface the portion of Madison Street between the railroad tracks (just west of Park Ave) and the Des Plaines River. The work will include the resurfacing of the asphalt, replacement of all pavement markings, and upgrading of the pedestrian crosswalks to meet current ADA standards.

Please note that this project is unrelated to the project that was recently completed by River Forest and Forest Park, between the railroad tracks and Des Plaines Avenue. IDOT anticipates that this work will begin in April and end in May of this year.

Message from River Forest Elementary School D90 - Kindergarten Registration Open

Registration for River Forest District 90 Kindergarten is open for children who turn five years of age on or before September 1. To begin the registration process, families must pick up a Kindergarten registration packet, which contains all of the forms and information needed to register, such as proof of residency.

For families who are new to District 90, registration packets are available at the Administration Building, 7776 Lake Street. Families will also have to make an appointment with Josephine Ribauda at 708-771-8282 or [via email](#) to complete the process. The hours for registration at the Administration Building are 8:45 AM – 11:00 AM and 1:00 PM – 3:30 PM. Families, who have a student already

attending a District 90 school, can pick up the Kindergarten registration packet at Lincoln School, 511 Park Avenue, or Willard School, 1250 Ashland Avenue.

District 90 encourages all families with children eligible for Kindergarten this year to register as early as possible. Doing so enables families to arrange the necessary appointments that are required to enroll in Kindergarten, such as medical, dental, and eye exams.

The first day of school is Thursday, August 24, 2017.
